

Events

August was a busy month. On August 6th AACS sponsored a motorized march commemorating the 55th Anniversary of the Voting Rights Act of 1965. The event was highly successful with 150 cars and one



motorcycle participating. The motorcade traveled passed the three Palm Coast early voting locations before ending in Bunnell at the county courthouse's parking lot. Speakers at the brief courthouse program included Flagler County NAACP President Linda Matthews, AACS Board Chair Edmund Pinto, and me.

On August 28th, another motorized march was held in collaboration with the Flagler NAACP to commemorate the 57th Anniversary of the 1963 March on Washington. This was a highly successful event with more than 300 cars and 2 motorcycles participating.

Center Administration

We have come back from the summer hiatus and fully entered fiscal year 2021, running from July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021. This is a friendly reminder that payments for annual membership dues now must now be completed since we are under a fiscal year dues schedule.

Facility Maintenance

As you know, the Board of Directors started the Maintenance Reserve Fund 2021 Campaign in September 2019 to obtain funds for two major expenses confronting AACS: replacing air-conditioners and roof replacement. Many thanks to all those members and friends for continuing to make donations to the Fund 2021 Campaign for our current needs and to build a reserve to handle some future big-ticket building related projects.

This year some donations have been used to obtain and fully pay for our new air-conditioners. Our attention now is focused on much-needed roof replacement, likely costing more than twice as much as the air-conditioners.

The following members have joined with me on the ad-hoc Roofing Committee to fully accomplish roof replacement: **Daniel Isaac, Edmund Pinto, Victor Krause, Merritt Robertson, Reinhold Schlieper,** and **William Seeney**. These members are drawn from the standing committees for Building and Grounds, Budget and Finance, Directors, and Officers.

I am pleased to announce that roofing company bids have been examined and R&K Certified Roofing has been selected as the primary contractor. Several AACS members have enjoyed previous experiences in using R&K for their roofs.

Working with R&K, a storm damage insurance claim has been filed so that AACS' expense will be limited to the amount of our insurance deductible. Expectations are that any interior damages to the building will be covered under the insurance claim.

Grants and Donations

Since AACS' income has been directly affected by the pandemic, we have obtained pandemic-related grants from the Florida Humanities organization to help meet our operating costs. Thanks to the Grants Committee, especially chair **Meshella Woods** and member **Stephanie Matthews**, for their work to get the grants.

Maintenance Reserve Fund 2021 Campaign

Last September, the Board of Directors announced the start of the Maintenance Reserve Fund 2021 Campaign, due to end in June 2021. The Campaign is designed to raise \$125,000 to correct the inadequate Reserve balance.

Every member is asked to donate during the Campaign in anticipation of AACS' 30th Anniversary in 2021. Although monthly pledge payments are encouraged, one-time gifts also help to reach our goal. Fiscal Year 2021 Budget

The operating budget for the fiscal year begun in July has been approved by the Board of Directors. The budget for total consolidated income is \$94,100 with 28% from Fundraisers, 18% from Center Rentals, 28% from Memberships, and 26% from Donations/Grants.

The budget for total consolidated expenses is \$90,700 with 22% for Cultural Programs, 39% for Center Maintenance/Utilities, 16% for Center Workers, 15% for Center Insurance/Licenses, 6% for the Center Office, and 2% for Professional Services.

Overall, the new budget anticipates net operating income of \$3,400 for the current year, slightly more than the actual \$2,800 income for the past fiscal year ended in June.
