Dear Member,

The continued success of AACS is highly dependent on qualified and dedicated directors and officers, strongly supported by the membership at large, and on clearly stated governing documents to guide courses of action. You are encouraged to firmly exercise your right as an AACS member and return your vote for those you wish to serve your organization as directors and officers from January 1, 2021 through December 31, 2023.

For the **Board of Directors**, please vote for no more than three (3) names from the nominated persons and write-in candidates you can name on the ballot.

For the **Executive Board of Officers**, three of the ten board positions are for election this year. Please vote for the nominated person or a write-in candidate you can name on the ballot.

On your secret ballot, a <u>yes vote</u> for a director or officer candidate must be indicated by <u>placing an X</u> in the box next to their name. A <u>no vote</u> for a candidate is indicated by <u>NOT placing an X</u> in the box next to their name.

To be elected, a nominated or write-in candidate must receive a majority of the valid votes received for the nominated position, that is at least one more vote than 50% of all votes. Also, a candidate for director to be elected must be among the top 3 candidates receiving valid votes.

After completing your secret ballot, please place it in the return addressed envelope you received with this notice and seal the envelope. Your ballot must be returned in the envelope you received from AACS. If you affix postage to your envelope and mail it to us, a postmark no later than November 18, 2020 is needed to ensure that your ballot will be received and counted. Alternatively, you may have your ballot hand delivered in the envelope you received from AACS to the deposit box in the Cultural Center lobby no later than 11:00 a.m. on Friday, November 20, 2020 for it to be counted. Please note that only the first ballot received from a Family Household membership group will be counted.
