

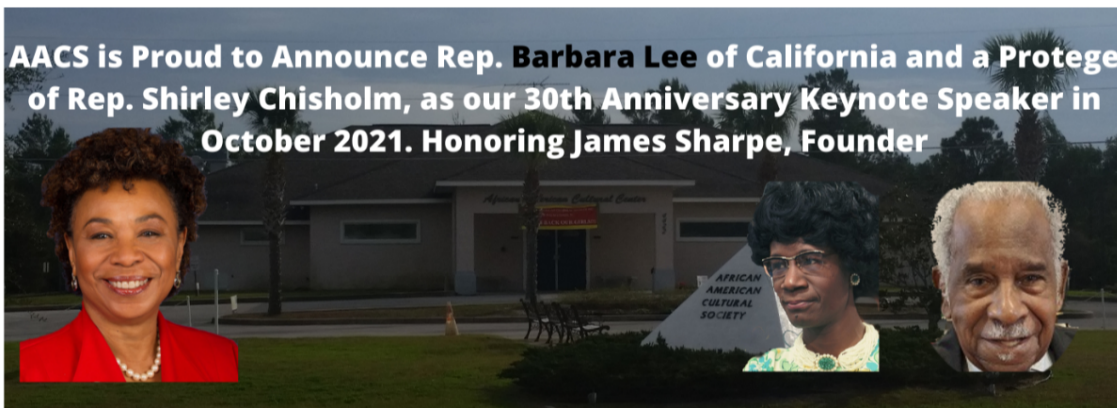

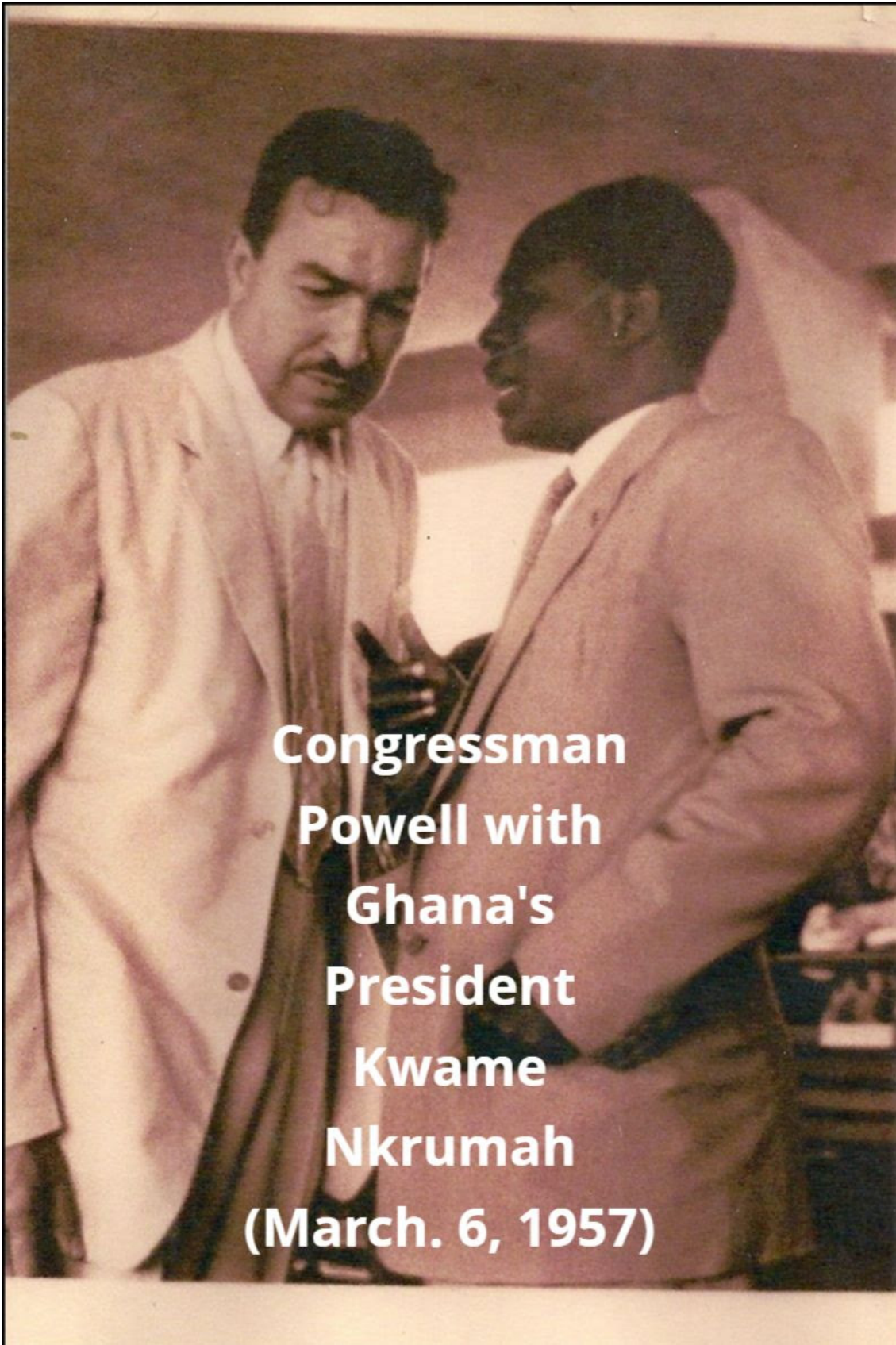

Dr. Kwame Nkrumah

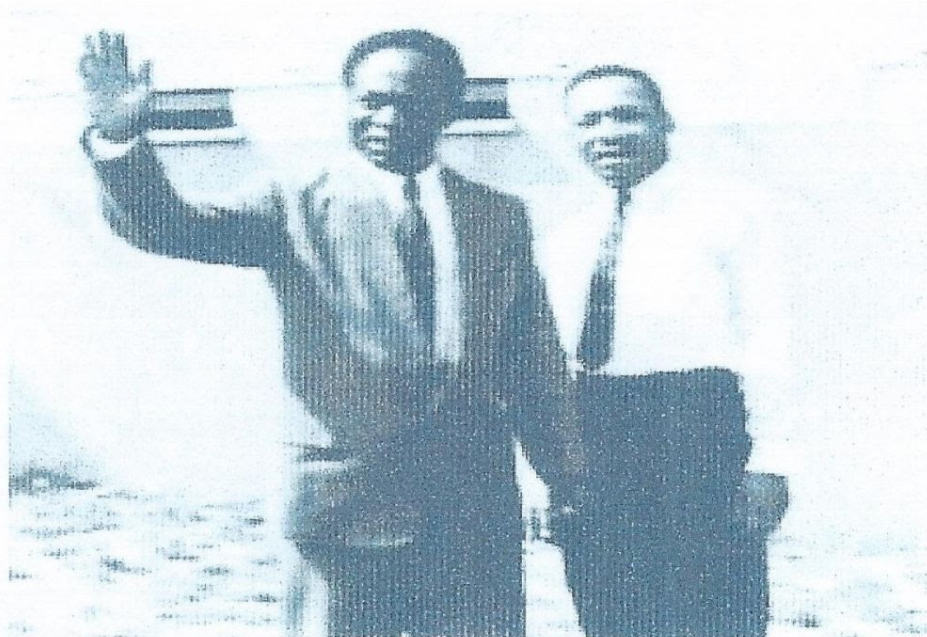
Prime Mover for African Unification and the 1st President of Ghana (March 6, 1957)

- Dr. Nkrumah was educated at Lincoln University in Pennsylvania.
- He was the primary organizer of the 5th Pan African Congress in Manchester England in 1945. Theme the 1945 Congress was "Africa for the Africans" as a tribute to Marcus Garvey.
- At the All African People's Conference, in 1958, Dr. Nkrumah said, *"This is the decade of African independence. Forward then to independence. Independence Now! Tomorrow the United States of Africa."*
- The Black Star on Ghana's flag comes from the Garvey movement and symbolizing the lodestar of the struggle for freedom on the African Continent.

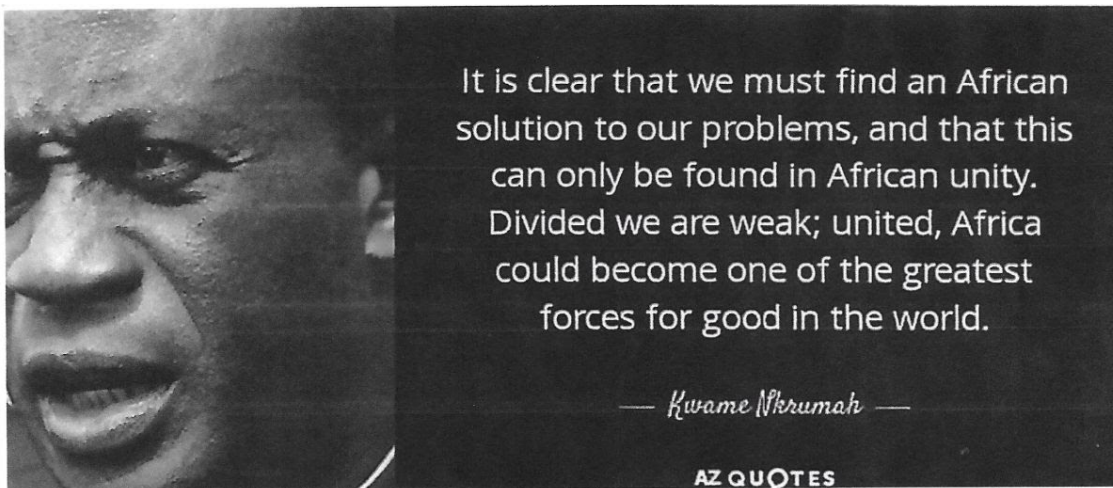


Dr. Nkrumah and Dr. King
